

## **Humane Education Coronavirus Changes & Information**

We are continuing to do everything we can to provide a fun and safe program experience while following all government mandates and safety recommendations. Please review the following information for what to expect for our programs based on current guidelines (updated July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022):

- 1. Face masks are no longer required but are up to the parents' discretion for the child while indoors.
  - We will have a few extra masks on hand just in case, but please bring your own as ours are not guaranteed to fit!
  - If your child (or anyone in your household) is not feeling well, is running a fever or displaying any symptoms please let us know immediately via phone or email.
- 2. Students will likely spend time both indoors and outdoors.
  - Close-toed shoes are required and please remember to dress appropriately for the weather! Camp and classes will be held rain or shine!
  - Students may be divided into smaller groups while viewing the animals. Groups will take turns visiting with each type of animal and participating in each activity.
- 3. Common areas, craft supplies and other mutual surfaces are disinfected between each program.
  - Hand sanitizer will be used before and after handling each animal. This has actually always been a rule at NAHS, we do not want to spread any germs to people or the animals!
